

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

# Impressive Progress in Maryland


Proportion of Maryland Children Ages 1-20 in Medicaid Receiving Dental Services FFY 2000 - FFY 2016




#### Many Low-Income Adults Lack Dental Benefits


### Adult Dental Coverage Varies Widely


